Vision: A transformed spiritual landscape of students/families in Rockingham County.

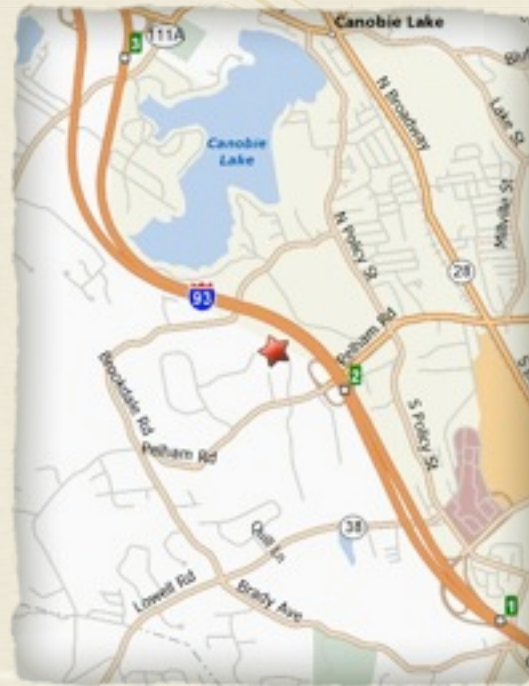
Mission: Meeting students where they are and helping them become Christian leaders.

A BREAKDOWN OF OUR PROGRAMS:

The Bridge - Sundays 4-6pm

Throughout the school year, 9-12th grade students gather most Sundays in the RCC foyer for a relaxed time of Bible study, food, and hot drinks. This coffeehouse-style environment is designed to help students connect the Bible to today's world.

The Path - Sundays 4-6pm

This is a time for 6-8th grade students to hang out, play some games, hear some Bible teaching, and participate in small group discussion. This group meets most Sundays during the school year.

Student Worship - Sundays 4-5:30pm

Once a month, all 6-12th grade students will gather together for an exciting time of musical worship designed specifically with teens in mind, complete with a lesson.

Worship - Sundays 8:30, 9:45, 11:00am

We encourage all our teenagers to join RCC in Sunday morning worship throughout the year. This is a great time to join in music and teaching with people of all ages. Several of our students even serve in the worship team, tech team, or hospitality team.

Ministry Teams

We encourage our students to get involved in ministry. We want them to use their God-given gifts for His Kingdom. If you are passionate about something, we've got the spot for you -- whether this be a worship team, greeting team, tech team, outreach team, etc.

Outreach Events & Service Projects
