LEADERSHIP RESPONSIBILITIES

Dear Leaders:

We are looking forward to what God will do in the lives of the young people you will be bringing to **DEEP FREEZE**. I hope that you are anticipating more than just a weekend full of fun. **DEEP FREEZE** is great fun but it is also a wonderful opportunity for ministry. **The real ministry takes place as we teach God's Word, relate in Christian love, and inspire by our godly example.**

***Please be sure you share these responsibilities with each of your leaders and make sure they understand their role. ***

Your responsibilities as a group leader fall into these basic categories:

SPIRITUAL

- Be in prayer that God would show you whom He would have you bring.
- Be a challenge to your young people to reach out to those God would have **them** bring.
- Be a model of Christian character (your kids do what you **do**, not necessarily what you say)
- Be sensitive to the spiritual needs of your group and those around you.
- Be ready to pray with the young people.
- Be prepared to participate in counseling after the meetings.
- Be open to whatever God would do in your own life.

RELATIONAL

- Make the first move in initiating conversation.
- Learn to listen. Teach *how to listen* by your example.
- Follow Camp Berea rules and enforce them gently but firmly.
- IF you must discipline, do it privately. (the Director is there to help if you need him)

GENERAL

- Be prepared for check in when you arrive! You need 1.) your completed Group Checklist, 2.) all Campers & Leaders' Information/Release Forms AND Paintball Waivers, and 3.) a credit card or check to pay your balance in full.
- Help with "crowd" control: Assist your group in the bunkhouse. Leaders will stay in the bunkhouse with their youth group. It is your responsibility to settle your group down at night. Assist at meals and at meetings by making sure your young people are all present and on time.
- Monitor or dispense your students' prescription medicines or other medical needs.
- Participate in activities (enthusiastically, please!) Plan or join in a Saturday afternoon activity.
- Get involved...**YOU** make a difference!

CAMP BERA PAINTBALL PARK

YOU MUST BE 12 OR OLDER IN ORDER TO PLAY PAINTBALL!!!!

This is a Release of Liability. READ BEFORE SIGNING. This form must be READ and SIGNED before the participant is allowed to take part in any paintball event at CAMP BERA of New Hampshire.

In consideration of being permitted to participate in any way in the sport and activities of paintball I acknowledge, appreciate, and agree that: 1. The risk of injury from the activity and weaponry involved in paintball is significant, including the potential for permanent disability and death, and while particular protective equipment and personal discipline will minimize this risk, the risk of serious injury does exist; 2. I KNOWINGLY AND FREELY ASSUME ALL SUCH RISKS, both known and unknown, EVEN IF ARISING FROM THE NEGLIGENCE of those persons released from liability below, and assume full responsibility for my participation; and, 3. I understand that the activities of paintball are physically and mentally intense. I understand the rules of play and will comply with all rules and regulations. If I observe any unusual or unnecessary hazard during my participation, I will bring such to the attention of the nearest official as soon as practical: and 4. I, for myself and on behalf of my heirs, assigns, personal representatives and next of kin, HEREBY RELEASE AND HOLD CAMP BERA OF NEW HAMPSHIRE, the owners and lessors of premises used to conduct the paintball activities, their officers, officials, agents and/or employees (Releasees), WITH RESPECT TO ANY AND ALL INJURY, DISABILITY, DEATH, or loss or damage to person or property, WHETHER CAUSED BY THE NEGLIGENCE OF THE RELEASEES OR OTHERWISE, except that which is the result of gross negligence and/or wanton misconduct. 5. I understand and agree that this Release of Liability Agreement covers each and every paintball activity and even in which I participate hereafter.

Frequently Asked Questions about DF Paintball

1. How old do you have to be to play paintball?
12 years or older
2. How much does paintball cost?
There is a \$10 field fee for each 1 hour session. This includes the use of your marker and 200 rounds of paint. Each extra 100 rounds of paint cost \$5.00 at the field.
3. Where do we play?
On Camp Berea's own paintball course. All games are closely monitored by our trained staff.
4. Can I bring my own equipment to camp?
Yes, you may bring your own equipment. You **must** turn it in at the office when you arrive on camp grounds.
5. How much does it cost if I bring my own equipment?
\$10 for each 1 hour session.
6. Can I bring my own paint?
No. This is standard procedure for paintball fields. You must buy our paint to play.
7. What do I do if I only have a CO₂ tank on my marker?
We have compressed air tanks you can use. CO₂ will not work under the cold New Hampshire conditions for any length of time so it is important to check that your marker is compressed air compatible before arriving at camp.
(Check your manual or with the manufacturer.)
8. What kind of clothes should I bring to play in?
Warm winter clothes! Warm socks, boots, a winter jacket, ski pants, hat, and gloves are a necessity. Paint will wash out of **most** fabrics with ease.
9. How important is the release form?
YOU CANNOT PLAY WITHOUT IT! You must bring a release form signed by your parent or guardian in order to play. Your signature (under 18) is also required on the "Participant's Signature" line. This does not mean you **have** to play but if you don't have it, you **can't** play.
10. Does turning in my form mean that I am signed up to play?
NO! You must sign up in person on Saturday afternoon and pay for your ticket at the Welcome Center.
